#### **Denbies Winery**

We set out on a pleasant Autumn day to Denbies Vineyard which nestles in a beautiful chalk valley in the Surrey countryside between Box Hill and the little town of Dorking. The coach arrived at our destination only to find our driver was unable to negotiate a low railway bridge and so we walked the final few yards to the reception area. Coffee and cakes were in plentiful supply in the onsite cafe and after a pleasant break we boarded a small train to be taken on a tour of the extensive estate. We ascended some 600 feet through beautiful wooded hillsides and then the guide stopped and gave us a very interesting talk on the type of grapes grown and the methods of picking the harvest which varied on the incline of the slopes. The flatter areas were mechanically harvested whilst the steeper slopes had to be handpicked. It probably helps if the pickers are fit and with the agility of a mountain goat. From our vantage point we had wonderful views of the vineyards and all the surrounding countryside. We then continued further up to the top of the estate where we were told of the original owner, Thomas Cubitt who was the founder of Cubitts the builders. He is famous for building Eaton Square, the frontage of Buckingham Palace and Osbourne House. The original home of the estate was indeed modelled on Osbourne House, we were told the Duchess of Cornwall spent much of her school summer holidays at the vineyard.

On our return to the visitors centre we had lunch followed by a tour of the cellars and bottling plant and were delighted to be given the chance to sample three of the different wines. Waitrose actually stocks the most renowned, - Summer Gold.

We returned to the coach and after a 10 minute drive visited a local farm which had a lovely tea room and plenty of cake! After an uneventful journey we returned to Allington just before 6pm.

Finally, a thank you to Rosemary for a delightful day.
